

A friend of mine had a habit of repeating thought provoking questions until it really gets through. One time he said to me, "The Lord sure has been good to you... but do you know anyone the Lord has not been good to?" I quickly agreed the Lord has been good to me, but what about that last part... "Do you know anyone the Lord has not been good to?"

What about BABIES who die? Has the Lord been good to them? YES! He allowed them to be born and become an eternal living soul. Dying before the age of accountability, most theologians agree, babies are under God's grace and therefore in Heaven. What's so bad about that? It's much better than not having been born and this should be a comfort to parents who have lost a baby.

What about people who SUFFER? Has the Lord been good to them? YES! Many times SUFFERING helps bring people to a right relationship with the Lord that may never have happened otherwise.

The Bible, God's Word says, "The Lord is good to ALL: and His tender mercies are over all His works" (Psalms 145:9). All people, whether good or evil, reap benefits from God. For example, He brings the daily sunrise and necessary rain for their food (Matthew 5:45).
