QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION & REVIEW for the "Projection for Survival" DVD Video and Power Point Show (PPS) #81507.

These questions are divided into five Sections to match the five SECTIONS of the PPS and DVD Video. You can print them one section at a time as you need them for classes.

Answers are in RED. When Scripture References are shown here, I suggest the teacher have the class members look up (perhaps take turns) and read the Scriptures for the answers so the Holy Spirit can work through God's Word. Please ask questions to promote "controlled discussion."

Questions make people THINK. Someone has wisely said, "We can't think without LEARNING and we can't learn without THINKING."

- 9. Considering the amazing Unity and Harmony of the Bible,
 - A. The Bible is made up of how many books? 66
 - B. They were written over about how many years? 1500
 - C. In how many languages? 3 (Hebrew, Greek and Aramaic)
 - D. By how many human writers? 40
 - E. What is the mathematical probability of the amazing Unity and Harmony of the Bible? happening by chance? Astronomical
 - F. What is the answer to this Biblical Unity and Harmony? 2nd Peter 1:20, 21. Only one author... the Holy Spirit of God who directed those 40 human writers.
- 19. How many ages or Dispensations are commonly seen in the Bible and presented on this DVD and PP Show? Seven
- 28. In each age, man is given a specific test or Responsibility. In every age, how do most people respond to that Responsibility? Disobedience and Failure. WHY is that? (Discuss) Sin and unbelief.
- 29. In each age, what is the end result of mankind's Disobedience and Failure? God's Divine Judgment. What demands God's Judgment for man's disobedience and sin? (Discuss) His Righteousness, Justice and Holiness.
- 30. What is the overall revelation of the seven tests? Mankind is utterly sinful and lost.
- 31. However, what does God demonstrate toward mankind in every age? His Love.
- 31. How is God's salvation offered in every age? By Grace alone through Faith alone.
- 35. As the TEST in the Age of Innocence, what was the command God gave to Adam and Eve? Gen. 2:16, 17-A Do not eat of the "Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil."
- 35. What did God say would be the result if they did eat of it? Gen. 17-B. They would die.
- 36. What did Satan say that was a lie? Gen. 3:4. That they would not die.

- 36. What did Satan say that was true? Gen. 3:5. That their eyes would be opened and they would gain the knowledge of good and evil. Does Satan still mix truth with lies today? YES. Do you have an example how he does that? In modern Religion today, the Bible is often used but misquoted or taken out of context. It's also mixed with humanistic philosophy.
- 37. As a result of Adam and Eve's disobedience, what JUDGMENTS came, relative to:
 - A. Snakes Gen. 3:14. They would eat the dust of the earth (crawling on their belly).
 - B. Earth Gen. 3:17, 18. The ground was cursed to grow thorns and thistles.
 - C. Woman Gen. 3; 16. Sorrow in childbearing (NIV "Pains in childbearing." Amp. Bible: "Grief, suffering and pangs of child-bearing.")
 - D. Man Gen. 3:19. Sweat and work for his livelihood.
 - E. LIFE Gen. 2:17. Romans 5:12 Death came on the entire human race.
- 37. In addition to Physical Death, how else did this judgment affect all mankind? Eph. 2:1, 5. Spiritual Death. Why did Adams's sin doom the human race to be eternally separated from God? (Discuss) Because God is absolutely Holy and sinless and sin can never come into His presence.
- 39. After Adam's, what is the central theme of the rest of the Bible? God's plan of redemption for man and the restoration of his fellowship with God.
- 40. When Adam and Eve realized they were naked, what did they try to do? Gen. 3:7, 8. They tried to hide their nakedness with fig leaves and they hid from God when God came to visit them in the Garden of Eden.
- 41. What are the fig leaves a type or picture of that is still common today? (Discuss) Titus 3:5. Isa. 64:6 Human efforts and human works of righteousness to try to hide sin and help earn salvation.
- 42. How did God demonstrate His love in Age #1? Gen. 3:21-A. He gave Adam and Eve "Coats of skins" (requiring animal bloodshed, pointing forward to Christ's shed blood for us.)
- 42. Will Adam and Eve be in Heaven? Gen. 3:21-B. "God clothed them." They trusted God and accepted the coats of skins He made for them to cover their sins.
- 43, 44. Have you heard the expression, "Just let your conscience be your guide" and is that a good philosophy today?" (Discuss) Was Conscience a sufficient guide in Age # 2? Gen. 6:5, 6. Wickedness of man was great. Every imagination and thought was only evil continually.
- 46, 47. What was the result of the wickedness of mankind in Age #2. Gen. 6:6, 7, 13; 7:21-23. God was grieved and brought the flood on the earth in Noah's day.
- 47. How many people escaped the flood in Noah's Ark? Gen. 6:10; 7:7. Eight people.
- 48. How did God demonstrate His love in Age #2, Conscience? Gen. 6:3. God gave them 120 years to repent. Gen. 6:14, 18. He told Noah how to build the Ark and saved Noah's family of 8 to preserve the human race.
- 49. What were the people to do after the flood? Gen. 8:15-17; 9:7. Go forth out of the Ark, be fruitful, multiply and replenish the earth.

- 50. How did the majority of the people respond to God's command? Gen. 11:4. They wanted to stay, build a city and tower to make them a name instead of being scattered to replenish the earth.
- 51. How did God scatter them? Gen. 11:7-9. God confused their language.
- 53. How did God demonstrate His love in Age # 3, Human Government?" He spared their lives and just confused their language.
- 55. What was the Conditional Promise God made with Abram? Gen. 12:1-3. Go to a land God would show him and God would make him a great nation, bless him and make his name great.
- 56. God also promised Abram that all the families of the earth would be blessed through him. How has that already happened at least two ways? 1. The Bible came through Jewish writers. 2. The human birth of Christ came through the Jewish race.
- 57. Why is God keeping the eyes of the world focused on the middle east and Israel in particular? Because much of future Bible prophecy is focused on the land and people of Israel.
- 59. What was God's "Directive Will" for Israel? Gen. 26:1-5. Dwell (stay) in the promised land.
- 60. When a famine came, rather than trust God for their provisions, what did God allow them to do as His "Permissive Will?" Gen. 46:3-6 Go down into Egypt. God sometimes grants our requests as His "Permissive Will," although it's not His BEST "Directive Will" for us. See Psa. 106:7-15.
- 61. How did they suffer by going into Egypt? Exodus 1:13, 14. Bondage and Slavery for hundreds of years.
- 62. Who did God raise up to deliver the children of Israel from the Egyptian Bondage? Exodus 3:1, 2. Moses.
- 63. Which of the Plagues on Pharaoh do you remember? Hail, boils, lice, swarms of flies, death of the Egyptian cattle and rivers turned to blood.
- 64. In Exodus 14:14, God promised to fight for the Children of Israel at the Red Sea Crossing. How did He do that? Exodus 14:25. He took the Egyptian's Chariot wheels off as they tried to cross the Red Sea.
- 68. Shallow views of God and His Holiness will produce shallow views of what? "Sin and the need for atonement." Discuss and explain what this means? Why do most people have such shallow views of God and His Holiness? (Discuss) Lack of knowledge and understanding of God's Word or... unbelief.
- 69. How do the Ten Commandments compare to a mirror? They don't remove dirt and sin, they just reveal it. A separate cleansing agent is needed to remove it.
- 70. What was and still is the primary purpose of the Ten Commandments? Gal. 3:24. To TEACH us the Holiness of God and sinfulness of man and to bring us to Christ for justification (salvation) by faith.
- 72. What did the Children of Israel promise to do when God gave them the Law? Exodus 19:8. They promised to keep the Law.

- 73. How well did they keep their promise to God? 2nd Kings 17:7-20. They failed miserably and the Lord was very angry with them.
- 74. Why do you think they failed to recognize Christ as the promised Messiah when He came at the end of that age? 2nd Kings 17:14 Like their fathers, they rejected His Word, hardened their necks and did not believe His Word. How should that fact affect our lives and warn us of a danger that may affect our children for generations? (Discuss) Our faith and obedience to God or rejection and unbelief may also affect our family for generations.
- 75, 76 At the trial of Jesus, when Pilate asked, "What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ?", what did the people cry out? Matt: 27:25. "His blood be on us, and our children." They literally invited God's Judgment on themselves and their children, because of their unbelief, rejection and hatred of Christ.
- 77. How were some historical ways that happened,? In AD 70 Titus destroyed Jerusalem and the Temple and killed 1,000,000 Jews. In WW II, Hitler killed 6 million Jews.
- 79. What did God predict 500 years in advance would happen to Israel that historical evidence confirms started in AD 70? Ezekiel 36:16-19. Their world wide dispersion.
- 80. What did God also predict 500 years in advance that He would eventually do for Israel? Ezekiel 36:20-24. Bring them back into their own land.
- 81. Is there historical evidence that Has He done that yet? If so, when? May 14, 1948 Israel became a new nation.
- 82. What is the next major prophetic promise of God for Israel? Ezekiel 36:25. The cleansing from their unbelief.
- 83. How has God demonstrated His love through Israel? He has preserved a remnant of Israel through their world wide dispersion and brought them back into their own land.
- 84. What were the two basic parts of the Law? 1. The Moral Law, the Ten Commandments. 2. The Ceremonial or Sacrificial Law.
- 85. Why was the Virgin Birth of Christ important? He did not inherit Adam's sin nature.
- 86. How did Christ fulfill the two parts of the Law? 1. With His virgin birth and sinless life, He kept the Moral part of the Law, the 10 Commandments. 2. With His sacrificial death, He fulfilled the Ceremonial part of the Law.
- 93. In the Tabernacle and later in the Temple in Jerusalem what separated the two rooms, the Most Holy Place from the Holy Place? A 15 foot high veil (which tradition says was so thick a pack of mules could not pull it apart.)
- 97. What happened to that veil when Christ died on the cross? Matt 27:51. It was torn in two from the top to the bottom.
- 98. What did that signify? That access to God was no longer barred. The work of atonement was done, "Paid in Full."

99. How do we know it is DONE? Hebrews 9:12. God says Christ "obtained eternal redemption for us." Notice, it's not FUTURE TENSE language like Christ **WILL** obtain... It is PAST TENSE language, He **OBTAINED**. It is DONE!

100. How do we know God was satisfied with the finished work of Christ? Hebrews 10:12. God raised him from the dead and Christ is now seated on the right hand of God.
